

The Gift Program



What is *The Gift*?

The Gift program is a part of the Louisiana Department of Health's Bureau of Family Health (BFH) Louisiana Perinatal Quality Collaborative (LaPQC). It is an evidence-based, two-tiered hospital designation program that provides resources and a framework to help improve breastfeeding rates and hospital success by improving the quality of birthing services and enhancing patient-centered care.

The Gift provides tools, training and quality improvement coaching to assist birthing facilities with implementing evidence-based practices for infant feeding and birthing person-infant bonding. *The Gift* awards *Gift* or *Gift Shining Star* designation to facilities that demonstrate consistent implementation of evidence-based practices aligned with the *Ten Steps to Successful Breastfeeding* of the Baby-Friendly Hospital Initiative (BFHI)*. *The Gift* program encourages progress toward and maintenance of Baby-Friendly™ designation.

Benefits to *Gift* Designation

- Free resources/tools and a framework to help birthing facilities improve breastfeeding outcomes.
- Technical assistance around continuous quality improvement and support for the pursuit of and maintenance of Baby-Friendly™ designation.
- Access to valuable training.
- Recognition in the form of *Shining Star* or *Gift* designation.
- Assistance in meeting national quality measures and standards.
- Increased quality of birthing services in a cost-neutral way.
- Competitive edge in an outcomes-based health care environment.
- A way to meet the growing demand from mothers for breastfeeding support.

Gift Designation

- Once enrolled, the birthing facility and *The Gift* team work together to implement quality improvement activities around the *Ten Steps*.
- *Gift* designation is awarded to birthing facilities that achieve benchmarks in four focus areas: evidence-based practices, *The Gift* Guidelines for Marketing of Breastmilk Substitutes compliance, consistent messaging, and quality improvement.
- Birthing facilities enrolled in *The Gift* collect data and participate in surveys at specified time periods for maintenance and re-designation.

Does *The Gift* make a difference?

- In Louisiana, only 70.1% of infants are ever breastfed, compared to 83.8% nationally.
- Breastfeeding initiation in *Gift* designated facilities was 75% vs 61% in non-designated facilities.
- Racial breastfeeding disparities are less prevalent in *Gift* designated facilities. Breastfeeding initiation among Black women in *Gift* designated facilities was 61% vs 48% in non-designated facilities.
- Women who delivered in *Gift* designated facilities were 59% more likely to initiate breastfeeding than women who delivered in non-designated facilities.

The Pregnancy Risk Assessment Monitoring System (PRAMS) is a surveillance project of the CDC and state health departments. It collects state-specific, population-based data on maternal attitudes and experiences before, during, and shortly after pregnancy.

The Ten Steps

1. Have a written breastfeeding policy that is routinely communicated to all health care staff.
2. Train all health care staff in the skills necessary to implement this policy.
3. Inform all pregnant persons about the benefits and management of breastfeeding.
4. Help pregnant persons initiate breastfeeding within one hour of birth.
5. Show birthing persons how to breastfeed and maintain lactation, even if separated from their infants.
6. Give infants no food or drink other than breast milk, unless medically indicated.
7. Practice rooming in – allow birthing persons and infants to remain together 24 hrs a day.
8. Encourage breastfeeding on demand.
9. Give no pacifiers or artificial nipples to breastfeeding infants.
10. Foster the establishment of breastfeeding support groups and refer birthing persons to them upon discharge.
